Good afternoon to you all and a warm welcome to both our visitors Ipswich Wanderers and of course our faithful supporters who we hope have once again turned up in their numbers.

SATURDAY 30TH MARCH ISTHMIAN LEAGUE NORTH **Bury Town 3 Felixstowe & Walton Utd 3**

Felixstowe & Walton United came back from a 3-1 halftime deficit to secure a point at fellow promotion challengers Bury Town. Bury made the stronger start but failed to capitalise on half chances created and it was the visitors who took the lead against the run of play in the 17th minute, **Josh Mayhew's** powerful header giving Beckwith no chance after a pinpoint cross from Stuart Ainsley. The Seasiders were kicking themselves shortly after when a failed clearance fell kindly to Cemal Ramadan who had the simple task of levelling the game on 25 minutes. Former Felixstowe favourite Ollie Canfer made it 2-1 on 34 minutes as he connected sweetly with a ball from the right and Luke Brown struck a low free kick from 20 yards on 43 minutes that Josh Blunkell could not hold, making it 3-1 on 43 minutes. Felixstowe started the second half strongly and debutant Ben Fowkes made a great run on 50 minutes and send in a perfect cross to the near post, **Henry Barley** beat Beckwith to it and slid the ball home from close range. Two minutes later and the scores were level again, Bury failing to clear the ball from the area twice before a side pass to **Barley** was slotted home neatly. Blunkell produced a stunning save

from Joe White to deny the Blues retaking the lead, but from then on it was the Seasiders who looked the more likely to win the game. With a minute to play of regular time a fine ball over the top led to Zak Brown turning his man and his speed took him away and clear, with the entire 1,285 crowd waiting for ball to nestle in the bottom corner, the shot across goal agonisingly screwed an inch wide to leave the visitors with their heads in hands and both sides taking a point.

The Seasideers storm into the Suffolk Premier Cup final following a superb all round team effort to beat their higher league opposition. The first half was just shaded by Leiston although both sides played their part in an entertaining and fast paced game. Loza headed in on 38 minutes to take a half time lead. The second half saw a phenomenal performance from Felixstowe, Henry Barley set up Leon **Ottley-Gooch** to fire in the equaliser on 51 minutes and it was Barley again playing in **Callum Harrison** on 69 minutes to finish superbly into the far corner. Leiston grew frustrated and were forced into long balls that the Seasideers defence dealt with and denied them any serious goalscoring opportunities from then on. Crane saw a second yellow to reduce Leiston to ten men for the last five minutes and Felixstowe saw out the lengthy added time brilliantly to send their supporters home happy in the pouring rain.

IPSWICH

WANDERERS CLUB HISTORY

- ▶ **1980** The Club started as an under 14's boys team in 1980 and two years later they entered the lowest division of the Ipswich Sunday League.
- ▶ **1987** Joined the newly formed Eastern Counties Division One sponsored by Jewsons in 1987 as founder members.
- ▶ **1994** Home games were played at our present ground at Humber Doucy Lane, under the name of Loadwell Ipswich. Jimmy Barker became a very influential chairman and he negotiated a name change to Lancaster Ipswich FC before we eventually became Ipswich Wanderers. Jimmy died in November 1994 and his presence is sadly missed. Thankfully after all his work he saw the floodlights switched on in September 1994 in a match against Ipswich Town.
- ▶ Great ground improvements were made in the early years under the direction of Development Officer Roger Woshalo and ground Manager Tim Davey.
- ▶ A losing Suffolk Senior Cup appearance in 1996/97 led to the following season becoming Champions of Division One, under the Chairmanship of Alan Haste, nine points clear of Maldon Town and losing only three league matches all season. Reaping the rewards of a successful youth policy which saw numerous trophies filling the clubhouse cabinet, a well organised side with a good balance between youth and experience saw us establish ourselves as a Premier Division side for a number of seasons until we suffered relegation on the last day of the 2002/3 season at Wisbech.
- ▶ **1996-97** The following season saw Jason Dozzell join the Club as Manager and after a midtable finish in his first campaign, the second season saw the Club sweep to the 1st Division title and with the assistance of Kevin Cunningham and Glynn Hague, the team finished 7th in the Premier Division in 2005/6, with the League's second best defence with home crowds on average exceeding 100.
- ▶ **2005-06** At the end of the 2005/6 Jason Dozzell and Chairman David Bugg left. Local businessman Ed Nicholls became Chairman and John Clarkson was appointed Manager having arrived with a reputation from the West Country. During the season he guided the club to the final of the Ridgeons League Cup, the 5th round of the FA Vase and a Suffolk Premier Cup Semi Final against Ipswich Town.
- ▶ **2006-07** At the end of the campaign John left the Club and with an exodus of players, the Club appointed ex player Louis Newman to the role, Louis built a young, inexperienced squad and after a poor start to the campaign which included some record defeats, was replaced by another former player Steve Buckle who was brought in to rebuild the squad and hopefully retain the Clubs' premier status. Unfortunately Steve was unable to prevent relegation and the only positive from the season was the Reserves capture of the Chell Trophy defeating Wroxham.
- ▶ **2007-08** Despite Steve's best efforts over the following few seasons the Club failed to build a promotion push throughout the campaigns and after a poor start to the 2011/12 season, Steve and Assistant Paul Grainger parted company with the Club. New chairman Terry Fenwick appointed Glenn Read and he brought in his own players and former Stowmarket Town boss Steve Jay as his assistant. He quickly revamped the squad and had the Club climbing the table before the end of the season.
- ▶ **2011-12** The 2012/3 season saw the Club just fail to clinch promotion to the Premier Division and lose on penalties in the semi final in the First Division Cup. The season did finish on a high as the Club clinched its first ever Suffolk Senior Cup trophy defeating local rivals Whitton United in the final. It was a remarkable victory coming from a goal down in normal time and then from 3-0 down in the penalty shoot out.
- ▶ **2012-13** 2013/14 saw promotion achieved with two long unbeaten runs ensuring a return to the Premier Division, we also lost a tight Senior Cup final against Whitton United and set a new club record with a 12-1 win over Downham Town.
- ▶ **2013-14** The 2014/15 was mixed as we adapted to Premier Division and finished 9th and enjoyed a good run in the FA Vase but off field the club lost one of its driving forces Roger Woshalo mid-season.
- ▶ **2014-15** In 2015-16 we defeated Canvey Island in the FA Cup and enjoy our best ever FA Vase run but with a heavy fixture backlog, relegation fears were only ended just before the season end. Glenn stepped down at the end of the season and for 2016-17 the Club appointed Shane Wardley as Player/Manager.
- ▶ **2015-16** Shane's first season saw us almost emulate our highest ever position, however, after a poor start to the 2017-18 season Shane resigned and following a disastrous spell under Mark Benterman, club legend Mark Goldfinch took over the side ably assisted by James Buckle and Daniel Thrower. Unfortunately, relegation could not be avoided and in 2018-19 we consolidated and lost in the Senior Cup Semi Final to Cornard.
- ▶ **2017-18** In 2019-20 with Stephen Boyle taking over as Chairman, we rebuilt and after a sticky spell in October we were closing in on the promotion pack and reached a Semi Final of the Suffolk Senior Cup before the season came to an abrupt end. With further additions on field and some good improvements off field under Stephen's leadership, we then looked to gain the vital promotion required for us to take the next steps forward with a good squad. The start to the next season was positive and a second Senior Cup trophy was clinched in the delayed final with a single strike from Connor Field clinching the trophy.
- ▶ **2019-20** After a couple of Covid-19 disrupted and curtailed seasons, for the 2021/22 season Wanderers went into action in the Thurlow Nunn First Division South. With what became a tight run affair and particular rivalry with Buckhurst Hill also aiming for the title, it went almost to the wire, Wanderers finally having the upper hand, and lifting the trophy with a goal 10 seconds from time in the final home game. With the final of the Suffolk Senior Cup to follow, we finished the season with 26 straight wins, and a well deserved double of league and cup was won!
- ▶ **2021-22** The following season started with four cup fixtures in the opening 7 games, and a haul of just 3 points from the first 5 league games meant Wanderers were already playing catch up when our league campaign really got going. A run of 6 wins in an 8 game unbeaten run helped to move us up the table before another rare defeat. More wins followed until in January, we visited top of the table Thetford, which ended in a 1-2 defeat. After this, Wanderers embarked on another 17-game winning run to the end of the season, including coming from behind to avenge the result against Thetford, going above them and ultimately become Thurlow Nunn Premier winners - back to back champions - and into Step 4 football for the first time in the club's history.
- ▶ **2022-23**

HERE'S LOOKIN' AT JUST, KID

When we talk about Casablanca, everybody thinks of the same thing. The dark charisma of Humphrey Bogart, the unparalleled beauty of Ingrid Bergman, and some of the greatest lines ever delivered on the silver screen. We don't, as a rule, think about one of the most prominent players in World Cup history. But until 1955 Morocco was part of the French empire, and so its players could be called up by the European nation. And so, a short, powerful striker who started his career in Casablanca went to the 1958 World Cup as a Frenchman, and became the highest scoring player at a single tournament ever. And he wasn't even supposed to play.

Just Fontaine grew up in Casablanca as one of seven children, and showed enough talent with a ball at his feet to join the local team in 1950, at the age of 17. He made an immediate impact, and over the next three years he made nearly 50 appearances for USM Casablanca, scoring 68 goals. It was enough to capture the attention of clubs in France, and Fontaine was ambitious enough to want, desperately, to play there. In 1953, he made the move to Nice. He also made his first appearance for the French national team, scoring a hat trick against Luxembourg, but didn't play for Les Bleus again for another year.

His time in Nice was interrupted by the requirement to complete two and a half years worth of national service, exacerbated by the Algerian War that was raging. But even

with his military commitments, he found the time to score 42 goals in 69 appearances.

When French champions, and European Cup finalists Reims lost star player Raymond Kopa to Real Madrid, they turned to Fontaine. The Moroccan, free of national service and able to focus on his football, was flying. He was top scorer in the French league over the next two seasons, which was enough to get him back into France squad. But Kopa was ahead of him, as was his Reims teammate Rene Bliard. He went to the 1958 World Cup as a reserve, not expecting to play very much. But when Bliard picked up an injury, he started the first game alongside Kopa. It was the start of a beautiful friendship.



He had to borrow a pair of boots for the opening game against Paraguay, and the South Americans scored first, but from then on it was all about the magic Fontaine and Kopa could work together. The Moroccan scored a hat trick, three of France's seven, as their

forward line clicked into gear. They lost to Yugoslavia in the next game, but Fontaine got another two. He and Kopa got one each in their final group game against Scotland, after which Scottish wing half Tommy Docherty described the pair as 'greased lightning'.

The quarter final against Northern Ireland saw the greased lightning working again, as Kopa worked his magic to create four goals. Fontaine got two of them, and their opponents couldn't find a response. It was a magnificent performance, which set up an exciting semi-final against a rampant Brazil, and their 17 year old wonderkid, Pele.

One of football's great 'what might have been' questions comes in the form of French defender Robert Jonquet. Fontaine scored early, but at 1-1 Jonquet clashed with Brazilian forward Vava, which fractured his fibula.

No substitutions were allowed in 1958, and remarkably, with the aid of a painkilling injection, Jonquet played on. But a hobbling passenger was no match for arguably the greatest player to ever play the game. Brazil ran out as 5-2 winners, the same scoreline by which they would beat Sweden in the final.

France had one more chance to play for some pride, in the third placed playoff final against reigning champions West Germany. The Germans had injuries of their own to contend with, and couldn't cope with the magic of the French attack. Fontaine scored first, and West Germany equalised, but then France ran riot. Fontaine won a penalty which he allowed Kopa to take, and then scored his

second. Germany pulled one back in the second half before France added three more, Fontaine getting four of the six. Their opponents added a consolation late on. That took Fontaine's total to 13, a record that has never been beaten. He was the only French top scorer at a World Cup until Kylian Mbappe.



The year following the World Cup, Fontaine was top scorer in the European Cup as well, firing Reims back to the final. But of all the teams in all the world, it was Real Madrid, inspired by one Raymond Kopa. The Spanish side won their fifth trophy in a row, and that summer Kopa rejoined Reims. The two played together for three more years, until Fontaine broke his leg and was forced to retire.

He ended his career with four league titles and two French cups, alongside 21 international caps with 30 international goals. But those 13 in 1958, those are what he'll be remembered for.

Enjoy the game.
