Stuart George Ainsley was born on January 19, 1988, to George and Shirley Ainsley at Ipswich Hospital. From a young age, Stu showed a remarkable talent for football. At just 3 years old, he was already kicking a football around the house and garden, showing neat striking of the ball with his right foot. By the time he turned 4, I encouraged him to develop his left foot as well. Stu's determination paid off, and he eventually was able to show me how good he was with his left foot, and what a cultured left-foot it has turned out to be.

Stu's formal football journey began with Trimley Red Devils, our home village club, where he started playing competitive games at the age of 5. Training with the under-6s, he quickly became a great team player with a fierce competitive spirit that has stood him well through his career.

At the age of 9, Stu joined the Ipswich Town Academy. His time at Ipswich was marked by significant achievements, including winning the FA Youth Cup in 2005. However, a personal highlight for Stu was scoring a goal at Anfield on his 18th birthday, takes some beating.

Stu eventually arrived back home to Felixstowe & Walton United where he has made many and helped build and progress this great football club in his 11 years here.

Well done Stu, Mam and Dad are very proud of you and your achievements in football and in life.

You have all watched on over the years and know full well what Stuart brings on the pitch - a fantastic left foot, solid defensively, passion, leadership to name just a few of his qualities but for me it is what he does away from the pitch, that many don't see that sets him apart from his peers.

He won't thank me for saying this as he does a lot of what he does without seeking thanks, praise or reward but instead does it because of a genuine love for our football club. He is always the first to volunteer for anything that we ask the players to do, ranging from help with mascots, watching the youth section, attending events at the club and much much more. He takes on the role of fines master every year, helps with moving sprinklers, manages the players kitty and generally when the players provide a donation, a card for ill health or a gesture of this nature to those involved with the club, it is always Stuart that will be a the heart of it. STUART ANSLEY

Ahead of his testimonial match this coming Friday, we put a few questions to the man himself, Stuart Ainsley.

Tonight we welcome Trimley Red Devils to the newly named Martello Ground for your testimonial match. Why was this fixture the one for you to mark this special occasion?

I started my career at Trimley when I was six and have lived in Trimley all of my life so it felt like that was the standout fixture for me.

How did signing for Felixstowe & Walton United come about?

It was summer 2015 and we had just won the play-off final at Lowestoft to go into the conference north. I was working in Thurrock at the time so playing in the north didn't really work for me. Kev O'Donnell was the manager at the time and I really liked the ambition he and the club had and made my decision really easy to sign for Felixstowe who were playing in the Thurlow Nunn league at the time.







With over 350 appearances for the club to date, what is your Seasiders highlight?

The FA Cup win against Bishop Stortford in 2016 stands out, they were step 2, we were step 5. It was probably the best result the club has ever had, Liam Hillyard with a last minute winner!

Which fixtures do you look forward to playing in the most?

I've always enjoyed playing against former teams, Canvey Island and Lowestoft are the two that stand out we've played in the last few years, both great clubs with good people and fan base.

Who have enjoyed playing alongside the most during your time at the club?

I would have to say my brother first for obvious reasons but closely followed by Dan Davis and Jordy Matthews, both would give everything they've got for 90 mins for the lads and the club.

Which opposition player have you least enjoyed playing against?

A young Josh Stokes nearly retired me a couple of years ago at away at Sudbury, ran rings around me all night and made me feel old! He's now a championship player at Bristol City.

What is your favourite goal scored?

Goals have dried up in the last few years so there not too many to chose from, but the one I remember was against Westfield in the FA Trophy, I cut in from the the left a found the bottom corner from 20 yards with my right foot!



What is your best achievement to date in football?

Would have to be winning the FA Youth Cup at Ipswich, it's what every club in the country wants to win at that age.

How many cards do you think you've tallied up during your time at the club?

I would guess at an average of ten a season, so probably around 90/100 or so, one in three games isn't too bad...

A few familiar faces will be returning for tonight's game, who are they and what made you pick these guys?

Yes I've invited a few legends back... Jordy Matthews, Dan Davis and Josh Kerridge. We have spent a lot of time together on and off the pitch over the years and all three are naturally fit so won't struggle with a good run around!

How was the club changed since you first signed?

Obviously the facilities at the club are so much better now, the old clubhouse was still in use when I first signed and the fan base has increased massively. I think we we were averaging around 80 on the gate when I first signed and now closer to the 400 mark shows how far the club has come in the local community.

What would you like to achieve in football before hanging up your boots?

I would love to help get this club to step 3 by winning the league, winning a trophy would top off my time here as it's the one thing that's been missing.

Who has been your biggest inspiration in the game?

I've always been thankful to Bobby Robson for bringing my dad down from Newcastle when he was 15, had he not done that dad would have never met my mum. I also always loved watching Ashley Cole growing up, being a left back he was the best around at the time.

tuart made his first appearance for the Seasiders on a cold January afternoon in 2010 at Walsham Le Willows in front of 74 spectators who had braved the elements to watch the sides played out a less than thrilling affair that ended 2-1 in the Seasiders favour, thanks to a goal from Dwayne Wright and an own goal.

Highlight of the day was that the MotM (Star Man) awarded by someone from the home side to one debutant Stuart Ainsley!

Stuart's home debut came on the 27th February 2010 in front of 98 spectators as we beat Hadleigh United 1-0 with the goal coming from Keith Hetherington.

His first goal for the club came on the 10th April 2010 here at the then 'Town Ground" against Dereham Town in front of 89 spectators.

He played 16 games for us in the second half of the 2009/10 season but was off to pastures new at the end of it, looking to play at a higher level which he did successfully before rejoining for his second spell at the start of the 2014/15 season when we were a far stronger team and club with better support and ambitious eyes on Step 4 football.

In the decade since Stuart's return we have built a new clubhouse, increased our support four-fold, opened an Academy and become an established step four club with those ambitious eyes now looking upwards at step 3 football.

A special night tonight for Stuart who celebrates his testimonial season with a game against a club where he has close ties, with many of his friends part of the Red Devils family, enjoy your evening Stuart!
